Answers to questions to date:

- 1. The DTA requires a modem that connects to the Internet via an Ethernet connection and is LTE (4G) capable.
- 2. The Cradlepoint IBR900 series, (e.g. IBR-600 M) and the Sierra Wireless MG90 are approved equals. Vendors may submit technical specifications for other modems to be considered as an approved equal until Tuesday, July 7, 2020.
- 3. The equipment connected to the modems on the buses will be the mobile fare payment validator from Masabi, an option for public Wi-Fi, a tie-in to our Automatic Vehicle Locator (%VL+) software, tie in with the Transit Signal Priority software, possible addition of streaming video from the on-board security cameras.
- 4. The DTA may use the modems in the future to act as dual mode AVL solution for use with our current radio system.
- 5. The DTA does not plan to use the modems for WLAN connections or for the TransitMaster reporting modules on the buses.
- 6. The DTA is requesting a separate price for training and installation support for the first ten modems.
- 7. Antennas should be included in the base price.
- 8. The DTA is considering future Wi-Fi on the buses, provided the DTA can manage the bandwidth requirements.
