Section 1. General Conditions

G-1 **REQUEST FOR BIDS**

- a) Bids are requested from experienced firms or Overhead Door Refurbishments at the Duluth Transit Authority (%DTA+) Operations Center, 2402 West Michigan Street, Duluth, MN 55806.
- b) This project is funded in part by a grant from the Federal Transit Administration, CFDA number 20.507.
- c) Bids shall be on the basis of total project costs for the project under the following requirements and conditions, which shall be considered an essential part of the Contract Documents.
- d) The DTA reserves the right to accept and/or refuse any or all Bids, to add or delete work without penalty, in the interest of the DTA.
- e) Bidder will bear all costs incurred in responding to this RFB.
- f) Bid prices shall be good for ninety (90) days after the Bid opening.
- g) Bids exceeding \$175,000 shall be accompanied by a certified check or a corporate surety bond in the amount of 5% of the base bid.
- g) The DTA intends to choose the lowest responsive and responsible Bidder as early as September 29, 2021.

G-2 **INQUIRIES**

G-3 **DEFINITION OF TERMS**

Whenever the following terms are used in these bid specifications, the intent and meaning of them shall be interpreted as follows:

- a. DTA, customer, buyer, or Operator shall mean the DTA.
- b. Project Manager shall mean Mr. Mark Ness, Director of Maintenance.
- c. Manufacturer, Vendor, Bidder, or Contractor shall mean that firm submitting the lowest, responsive, and responsible Bid and subsequently receiving the Contract award from the DTA as detailed in these specifications.

G-4 SUBSTITUTIONS AND OR EQUAL

- a) Where proprietary names are used in these specifications, it is understood that they are followed by the words % requal +:
- b) Please note that DTA personnel are NOT allowed to discuss the RFB with anyone, including Bidders, before the Bid submission deadline without permission, except that prime contractors and /or subcontractors may make appointments to discuss these specifications with the Procurement Manager. This, however, does not relieve them from the written, documented request required by paragraph c) below. Where prior approval is called for in the specifications it means prior to Bid opening. Minutes of discussions and responses to questions will be provided to all Bidders in the form of an addendum to this RFB.
- c) Requests for approved equals, clarifications of specifications, and protest of specifications must be received by the Procurement Manager in writing via email (preferred) or regular mail no later than 2:00 p.m. on Wednesday, September 1, 2021. Any request for an approved equal must be fully supported with technical data, test results, or other pertinent information as evidence that the substitute offered is equal to or better than the specifications that pertain to an item under consideration. The supporting evidence for the approved equal must be submitted with the request for approval. All requests must be

- submitted via email or US Mail unless otherwise approved by the DTA Procurement Manager in writing.
- d) The replies to request under paragraph c) above will be posted in the form of an addendum to this RFB on the DTA website at www.duluthtransit.com/doingbusinesswithus on Thursday, September 2, 2021.
- e) Changes to the specifications will be made **only** by **written** addendum.

G-5 **SELECTION CRITERIA**

The DTA will choose based on the lowest responsive and responsible Bidder.

G-6 **PREPARATION OF BID**

Bids must be submitted on the forms attached. All blanks in the Bid form must be completed with ink or typewriter. Bids containing alterations or erasures may be rejected unless the alteration or erasure is corrected by crossing out the error, inserting the correction adjacent thereto with ink or typewriter and initialing the correction in ink by the person signing the Bid. In the event any price term is expressed by the Bidder in both written and numerical form, the **written** representation shall govern in the event of an inconsistency.

Bids shall not stipulate any condition not contained in the specifications and other documents submitted for Bid.

Each Bid and all papers bound and attached thereto, shall be emailed to nbrown@duluthtransit.com, or placed and securely sealed in an envelope marked: "Overhead Door Refurbishments" and mailed or delivered to:

Bids must be received no later than **2:00 p.m. on Tuesday, September 14, 2021**. Time means local time in Duluth, Minnesota. Late Bids will not be considered. Fax Bids will not be considered. The DTA reserves the right to accept or reject any and/or all Bids in the best interest of the Authority.

No Bid may be modified after submission except by written modification physically received by the DTA prior to the time set for the opening of Bids. Modifications must be signed by the person submitting the Bid or accompanied by an explanation as to why it is not and must indicate that it modifies the original Bid. Modifications shall be submitted in a pdf attachment to an email or a securely sealed envelope marked as indicated on the Bid Form.

G-7 WITHDRAWAL OF BIDS

A Bidder may withdraw its Bid at any time before the time set for the opening of the Bids only in writing addressed to the DTA marked WITHDRAWAL OF BID+and emailed or physically received to the DTA Procurement Manager prior to the time for the opening of Bids.

G-8 CONSIDERATION OF BID

The DTA reserves the right, in the determination of the lowest, responsive and responsible Bidder, to consider the ultimate economy of the Bid within the guidelines of these specifications, to reject any and/or all Bids, including, but not limited to the determination that the Bid was incomplete, non-responsive, obscure or lacking the necessary details and specificity, that the Bidder lacks qualifications, experience and/or responsibility necessary to provide the goods and services, or that Bidder failed or neglected to complete and submit any information within the time

specified. The DTA may cancel the RFB, issue subsequent RFBs, or waive any errors or informalities in any Bid, in the best interests of the DTA.

G-9 **ADDENDA**

It is the Bidders responsibility to assure the receipt of all addenda to this Request for Bids. All documents will be posted online at www.duluthtransit.com/doingbusinesswithus. In addition, Bidders may inspect the Bid documents at the DTA offices, 2402 West Michigan Street, Duluth, MN 55806, during business hours.

G-10 BID CONTENTS CERTIFICATION

By submitting a Bid, the Bidder warrants that the information provided is true, correct and reliable for purposes of Contract award. The submission of inaccurate or misleading information may be grounds for disqualification from Contract award and may be subject the Bidder to suspension or debarment proceedings, as well as other remedies available to the DTA or the Minnesota Department of Transportation.

G-11 CONTRACT FORM AND CHANGES

A sample Contract is included in this RFB. Any proposed change in this Contract or Purchase Agreement shall be submitted to the DTA for its prior approval. Only written change orders, amendments or addenda, signed by the General Manager of the DTA, shall be binding upon the DTA.

The chosen Bidder, within twenty (20) days after the award of the Contract from the DTA shall sign the formal Contract or purchase agreement.

G-12 **BONDING REQUIREMENTS**

Bids exceeding \$175,000 must be accompanied by a certified check or Bid Bond in the amount of five percent (5%) of the total Bid price at the time of Bid submittal. A one hundred percent (100%) performance and payment bond is required from the successful Bidder in accordance with the requirements herein.

G-13 PRICE COMPLETE

The price quoted in any Bid submitted shall include all items of services, labor, material, alterations, tools, equipment and other costs necessary to fully complete the production and delivery of the equipment pursuant to these specifications. It is the intention of these specifications to provide and require complete equipment of the type prescribed herein. Any items omitted from the specifications which are clearly necessary for the operation of such equipment shall be considered included in the Bid specifications although not directly specified or called for in these specifications. No advantage shall be taken by the Bidder, manufacturer or supplier in the omission of any part or detail which goes to make the equipment complete and ready for service or use.

G-14 STATE, FEDERAL, OSHA SAFETY REQUIREMENTS

All work performed under this Contract shall conform to all latest local, state, and federal safety requirements and shall, in all cases, meet OSHA requirements. It shall be the Contractor responsibility to ensure complete compliance with these requirements.

G-15 **DISPOSITION OF BIDS**

All materials submitted in response to this RFB will become the property of the DTA, and will become public record in accordance with Minnesota Statutes §13.591 after the award process is complete.

G-16 PROTEST PROCEDURES

Protests will only be accepted from prospective bidders or offerors whose direct economic interest would be affected by the award of a contract or refusal to award a contract. The General Manager will consider all such protests, whether submitted before or after the award of a contract. If oral objections are raised and the matter cannot be resolved to the satisfaction of the objector, a written protest shall be required before any further consideration is given. Protest submissions should be concise, logically arranged, and clearly state the grounds for the protest. Protest must include at least the following information:

- Name, address, and telephone number of protestor
- Identification of the solicitation or contract number
- A detailed statement of the legal and factual grounds of protest including copies of relevant documents
- A statement as to what relief is requested

All protest documents received by the General Manager shall be stamped with date and time received and logged into a protest file folder with a copy to the Master File.

PROTESTS BEFORE AWARD

Protests before award must be submitted within the time as specified herein. If the written protest is not received by the time specified, the evaluation process shall continue in the normal manner unless the Finance Director, upon investigation, finds that remedial action is desirable, in which event such action shall be taken.

The protests addressing the adequacy of Invitation for Bids, RFPs, including, without limitation, the preaward procedure, the Instructions to Bidders or Proposers, General Terms and Conditions, Technical Specifications and Scope of Work, must be filed at the Finance Department no later than three days before the scheduled opening date or the bid or proposal. Thereafter, such issues are deemed waived by all interested parties.

Notice of protest and the basis therefor shall be given to all bidders or proposers. In addition, when a protest against the making of an award is received and the Finance Director determines to withhold the award pending disposition of the protest, the bidders or proposers whose bids or proposals might become eligible for award shall be requested, before expiration of the time for acceptance of their bids or proposals, to extend the time for acceptance (with consent of sureties, if any) to avoid the need for readvertising.

When a written protest against the making of an award is received, award shall not be made until five days after the matter is resolved, unless the General Manager determines that:

- " the items to be procured are urgently required; or
- " delivery or performance will be unduly delayed by failure to make the award promptly; or
- failure to make prompt award will otherwise cause undue harm to DTA or the State or the Federal Government.

In the event the General Manager determines that the award is to be made during the five-day period or during the pendency of protest, he/she shall notify the FTA prior to make such award. FTA preserves the right not to participate in such procurement.

If award is made, the Finance Director shall document the file to explain the need for an award, and shall give written notice of the decision to proceed with the award to the protestor and, as appropriate, to others concerned.

PROTESTS AFTER AWARD

Protests against award must be filed at the Finance Department within five days immediately following the award. The Finance Director shall review the protests. The contractor shall be furnished with the notice of protest and the basis therefor. Also, when it appears likely that an award may be invalidated and a delay in receiving the supplies or services is not prejudicial to DTA's interest, the Finance Director shall inform the contractor that DTA will not be responsible if the award is set aside and that the contractor proceeds with performance at his/her own risk.

DECISION ON PROTEST

The General Manager shall render his/her decision in writing within 14 days from the receipt of the written protest and shall provide written notice of such decision to all interested parties.

Following an adverse decision by the General Manager, the protestor may file a protest with FTA. For details, see FTA Circular 4220.1F, as amended, which states that FTA will only review protests regarding the alleged failure of a grantee (here, the DTA) to have written protest procedures or alleged failure to follow such procedures.

G-17 ORGANIZATION CONFLICTS OF INTEREST

- a. An organization conflict of interest means that because of other activities or relationships with other persons or entities, a Contractor is unable, or potentially unable to render impartial assistance or advice to the DTA, or the Contractors objectivity in performing the Contract work is, or might be otherwise impaired, or the Contractor has an unfair competitive advantage. Organizational conflict of interest includes situations where the capacity of a Contractor (including the Contractors executives, directors, consultants, subsidiaries, parent companies or subcontractors) to give impartial, technically sound advice or objective assistance is or may be impaired or may otherwise result in a biased work product because of any past, present or planned interest, financial or otherwise, in the DTA.
- b. The Contractor is responsible for maintaining and providing up to date conflict of interest information to the DTAs Director of Finance. If, after award of this Contract or task order, the Contractor discovers a conflict of interest with respect to this Contract or task order which could not reasonably have been known prior to award, or if any additional conflicts or potential conflicts arise after award, the Contractor shall give written notice to the DTAs Director of Finance as set forth below.
- c. The Contractors notice called for in paragraph 2 above shall describe the actual, apparent or potential conflict of interest, the action(s) the Contractor has taken or proposes to take to avoid or mitigate any conflict, and shall set forth any other information which the Contractor believes would be helpful to the DTAs Director of Finance in analyzing the situation.
- d. The Contractor has the responsibility of formulating and forwarding a proposed mitigation plan to the DTAs Director of Finance, for review and consideration. This responsibility arises when the Contractor first learns of an actual, apparent, or potential conflict of interest. Corporate counsel review of the proposed mitigation plan is necessary to ensure a timely review and final determination by the DTAs Director of Finance.
- e. If the DTAs Director of Finance, in his/her discretion, determines that the Contractors actual, apparent or potential conflict of interest remains, or the measures proposed are insufficient to avoid or mitigate the conflict, the DTAs Director of Finance will direct a course of action to the Contractor designed to avoid, neutralize, or mitigate the conflict of interest. If the parties fail to reach agreement on a course of action, or if having reached such agreement the Contractor fails to strictly adhere to such agreement during the remaining period of contract performance, the DTAs Director of Finance has the discretion to terminate the contract for default. No determination by the DTAs Director of Finance under this clause shall be reviewable under FAR Clause 52.233-1, Disputes Clause (MAY 2014),+which is also incorporated by reference herein.

f. The Contractors misrepresentation of facts in connection with a conflict of interest reported or a Contractors failure to disclose a conflict of interest as required shall be a basis for default termination of this Contract.

G-18 TAXES

The DTA is exempt from payment of the Federal excise, transportation tax, Minnesota State sales tax and City of Duluth City sales tax for services. Contractor shall include all applicable sales or use taxes as required under MN Department of Revenue guidelines and MN Statute 297A.61, subd.58. Projects utilizing state of Minnesota funds also require a Minnesota Form IC 134 form with the final pay application.

Unless a Certificate of Exemption is provided, any out of state bidder receiving a Bid award will have eight percent (8%) retained from invoice payments on any contracts over \$50,000. Submit a signed copy from the State of Minnesota when submitting Payment and Performance Bonds. G-19 PROMPT PAYMENT TO SUBCONTRACTORS.

In accordance with Minnesota § 337.10 (3), Contractor shall pay any subcontractor or material supplier within ten (10) days of receipt by the party responsible for payment of payment of undisputed services provided by the party requesting payment. The Contractor shall pay interest of at least one and one-half percent (1-1/2%) per month to the party requesting payment on any undisputed amount not paid on time. The minimum monthly interest payment for an unpaid balance of \$100 or more is \$10. For an unpaid balance of less than \$100, the party responsible for payment shall pay the actual penalty due to the party requesting payment. A party requesting payment who prevails in a civil action to collect interest penalties from a party responsible for payment must be awarded its costs and disbursements, including attorneys fees incurred in bringing the action.

Contractor shall further require this provision to be included in all contracts between subcontractors and sub-subcontractors of any tier.

G-20 SUBCONTRACTOR REPORTING

- a. The Bidder shall disclose all Subcontractors and their involvement in the project at the time of Bid submittal.
- b. The Contractor shall ensure that procurement activities for its Subcontractors (of any tier) and Suppliers on the project comply with the DTAs guidelines and requirements. The DTA reserves the right to reject any Subcontractor (of any tier) or Supplier without cause, and prior to award, upon notice from the DTA Procurement Manger, Contractor shall seek a different Subcontractor or Supplier in compliance with the above provisions.
- c. The Contractor shall insert the required Federal and State provisions into every subcontract, along with the applicable prevailing wage determination(s) and require submission of weekly reports in accordance with the specifications herein.
- d. If any Subcontractor employed by the Contractor or any person employed by the Contractor or by a Subcontractor fails to perform the assigned Work in a proper and skillful manner, or becomes intemperate, disorderly, abusive or harassing, the Contractor shall remove that Subcontractor or person from the project as directed in writing by the DTA. The Contractor shall not employ that Subcontractor or person again on any portion of the project unless otherwise approved by the DTA in writing. If the Contractor fails to provide suitable and sufficient personnel for the proper execution of the Work, the DTA may suspend Work until the Contractor complies with the direction from the DTA.

- e. Contractor shall provide with each pay application submitted to the DTA, a separate, itemized summary of all retainage Contractor has withheld from subcontractors and suppliers on the project.
- f. Contractor shall provide a copy to the DTA of any notices to proceed, default notifications, notice to cure, termination notices, lien waivers, contract close-out documents, notice of acceptance, or other correspondence with Subcontractors (of any tier) and suppliers relevant to the project.
- g. In the event a subcontractor (of any tier) or supplier is found in default of any applicable federal, state or local law, ordinance, regulation or requirement promulgated by any agency as it relates to the project, or in default of their contract, Contractor shall immediately report such default to the DTA in writing along with any documents, reports or other information pertinent to the default.

G-21 REQUIRED INSPECTIONS

The Contractor is responsible for requesting and scheduling any required building code inspections for all work on the project, including work completed by any subcontractor of any tier, and shall provide the DTA with a copy of all inspection reports.

G-22 SINGLE RESPONSE

If only one Bid is received in response to this RFB, a detailed cost/price analysis may be requested of the Bidder. A cost or cost and price analysis and evaluation, and/or audit of the cost may be performed in order to determine if the price is fair and reasonable. If the DTA Procurement Manager determines a cost analysis is required, the Bidder must be prepared to provide, upon request, cost summaries of estimated costs (i.e. labor, equipment, supplies, overhead, etc.) and documentation supporting all cost elements.

G-23 NO ENDORSEMENT

The Contractor must not claim that the DTA endorses the Contractors products or services.

Section 2.

FEDERAL TRANSIT ADMINISTRATION

Contract Clauses

A.1 ACCESS TO RECORDS 49 U.S.C. § 5325(q)

Clause

- a. <u>Records Retention.</u> The Contractor will retain, and will requires its subcontractors of all tiers to retain, complete and readily accessible records related in whole or in part to the contract; including, but not limited to, data, documents, reports, statistics, sub-agreements, leases, subcontracts, arrangements, other third party agreements of any type, and supporting materials related to those records.
- b. <u>Retention Period.</u> The Contractor agrees to comply with the record retention requirements in accordance with 2 C.F.R. § 200.333. The Contractor shall maintain all books, records, accounts and reports required under this Contract for a period of not less than three (3) years after the date of termination or expiration of this Contract, except in the event of litigation or settlement of claims arising from the performance of this Contract, in which case records shall be maintained until the disposition of all such litigation claims or exceptions related thereto.
- c. <u>Access to Records</u>. The Contractor agrees to provide sufficient access to FTA and its contractors to inspect and audit records and information related to performance of this contract as reasonably may be required.
- d. <u>Access to the Sites of Performance.</u> The Contractor agrees to permit FTA and its contractors access to the sites of performance under this Contract as reasonably may be required.

A.2 BONDING REQUIREMENTS 2 CFR §200.325, 31 CFR Part 223

Bond Requirements

Bidders shall furnish a bid guaranty in the form of a bid bond, or certified treasurers or cashiers check issued by a responsible bank or trust company, made payable to the Duluth Transit Authority. The amount of such guaranty shall be equal to 5% of the total bid price for bids over one hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$150,000.00).

In submitting this bid, it is understood and agreed by Bidder that the Duluth Transit Authority reserves the right to reject any and all bids, or part of any bid, and it is agreed that the bid may not be withdrawn for a period of ninety (90) days subsequent to the opening of bids, without the written consent of the Duluth Transit Authority.

It is also understood and agreed that if the undersigned Bidder should withdraw any part of all of his bid within ninety (90) days after the bid opening without the written consent of the Duluth Transit Authority, or refuse or be unable to enter into this Contract as provided above, or refuse or be unable to furnish adequate and acceptable Performance and Payment Bonds, or refuse or be unable to furnish adequate and acceptable insurance as provided herein, it shall forfeit its bid guaranty to the extent the Duluth Transit Authority damages occasioned by such withdrawal, or refusal, or inability to enter into an agreement, or provide adequate security thereof.

It is further understood and agreed that to the extend the defaulting bidders bid guaranty shall prove inadequate to fully recompense the Duluth Transit Authority for any damages occasioned by default, then the undersigned Bidder agrees to indemnify the Duluth Transit Authority and pay over to the Duluth Transit Authority the difference between the bid guarantee and the Duluth Transit Authoritys total damages so as to make the Duluth Transit Authority whole.

The undersigned understands that any material alteration of any of the above or any of the material contained herein, other than that requested will render the bid unresponsive.

Performance Guarantee

A Performance Guarantee in the amount of one hundred percent (100%) of the Contract value for contracts over one hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$150,000) is required by the Duluth Transit Authority to ensure faithful performance of the Contract. Either a Performance Bond or an Irrevocable Stand-By Letter of Credit shall be provided by the Contractor and shall remain in full force for the term of the Contract. The successful Bidder shall certify that it will provide the requisite Performance Guarantee to the Duluth Transit Authority within ten (10) business days from Contract execution. The Duluth Transit Authority requires all Performance Bonds to be provided by a fully qualified surety company acceptable to the Duluth Transit Authority and listed as a company currently authorized under 31 C.F.R. Part 22 as possessing a Certificate of Authority as described hereunder. The Duluth Transit Authority may require additional performance bond

protection when the contract price is increased. The increase in protection shall generally equal one hundred percent (100%) of the increase in the Contract price. The Duluth Transit Authority may secure additional protection by directing the Contractor to increase the amount of the existing bond or to obtain and additional bond.

If the Bidder chooses to provide a Letter of Credit as its Performance Guarantee, the Bidder shall furnish with its bid, certification that an Irrevocable Stand-By Letter of Credit will be furnished should the Bidder become the successful Contractor. The Bidder shall also provide a statement from the banking institution certifying that an Irrevocable Stand-By Letter of Credit for the action will be provided if the Contract is awarded to the Bidder. The Irrevocable Stand-By Letter of Credit will only be accepted by the Duluth Transit Authority if:

- 1. A bank in good standing issues it. The Duluth Transit Authority will not accept a Letter of Credit from an entity other than a bank.
- 2. It is in writing and signed by the issuing bank.
- 3. It conspicuously states that it is an irrevocable, non-transferable, %tandby+Letter of Credit.
- 4. The Duluth Transit Authority is identified as the Beneficiary.
- 5. It is in an amount equal to 100% of the Contract value. This amount must be in U.S. dollars.
- 6. The effective date of the Letter of Credit is the same as the effective date of the Contract.
- 7. The expiration date of the Letter of Credit coincides with the terms of this Contract.

The Duluth Transit Authority may terminate this contract, in whole or in part, at any time by written notice to the Contractor when it is in the Duluth Transit Authoritys best interest. The Contractor shall be paid its costs, including contract close-out costs, and profit on work performed up to the time of termination. The Contractor shall promptly submit its termination claim to the Duluth Transit Authority to be paid the Contractor. If the Contractor has any property in its possession belonging to the Duluth Transit Authority, the Contractor will account for the same, and dispose of it in the manner the Duluth Transit Authority directs.

Termination for Default [Breach or Cause] (General Provision)

The Contract Documents in priority order consist of Federal Transit Administration Contract Clause, this Contract; Request for Bids (Procurement # 041-21-2021.6) dated August 16, 2021, General, Special and Technical Specifications and Drawings; prevailing wage schedules, all addenda issued prior to and all modifications issued after execution of the Contract; and the Contractors executed Bid form and Required Certificates, all as fully a part of the Contract as if attached to this Contract or repeated herein.

ARTICLE 2 THE WORK

The Contractor shall perform the work required by the Contract Documents for this Request for Bids for the provision of Overhead Door Refurbishments in accordance with the generally accepted standards of the profession for services of this type.

Said obligation does not include indemnification of the DTA, ATE Management of Duluth, and First Transit, Inc. for claims of liability arising out of the sole negligent or intentional acts or omissions of DTA, ATE Management of Duluth, and First Transit, Inc., but shall include, but not be limited to, the obligation to defend, indemnify and save harmless the DTA, ATE Management of Duluth, and First Transit, Inc. in all cases where claims of liability against the DTA, ATE Management of Duluth, and First Transit, Inc., and the State of Minnesota arise out of acts or omissions of DTA, ATE Management of Duluth, and First Transit, Inc., which are derivative of the negligent or intentional acts or omissions of Contractor, such as, and including but not limited to, the failure to supervise, the failure to warn, the failure to prevent such act or omission by Contractor and other of such source of liability. In addition, Contractor will comply with all local, state and federal laws, rules and regulations applicable to this Contract and to the work to be done and things to be supplied hereunder.

SECTION 6. TECHNICAL/SPECIAL SPECIFICATIONS A. General

- 1. The DTA is seeking qualified firms to remove and replace up to two high-speed overhead doors for buses entering and exiting the Duluth Operations Center, 2402 West Michigan Street, Duluth, MN 55806. Scope of work includes a complete replacement of the door system, including replacing curtains, drive motors, sensors and controls and other ancillary equipment necessary for safe and reliable door operation. The doors are located on the east side and the west side of the building and allow transit buses to enter and exit the building quickly and safely. The DTA is seeking a %urnkey+door refurbishment so the operable components of the door are all new and under warranty.
 - 2. Work will be completed in two phases, one door to be completed by January 31, 2022 and one in 2023, subject to funding availability.
 - 3. Contractor must be an original manufacturer, distributor or dealer authorized by a manufacturer with service and repair capabilities for the proposed product to be installed. The DTA intends to award the work to a single contractor.
 - 4. There will be a non-mandatory prebid meeting at **10:00 a.m. on Tuesday, August 24, 2021**. attendees will be provided a tour of the facilities after the meeting. Those who are unable to attend or prefers to attend virtually, may call 218-623-4329 for alternate arrangements.
 - 5. The Bidder shall demonstrate a minimum of three (3) years of experience in similar projects and provide a list of most recent projects completed. Bidders who have failed to perform similar projects satisfactorily to or to complete similar projects on time may be disqualified at the sole discretion of the DTA.
 - 6. The DTA is relying on the Contractor to provide its professional experience and expertise with regard to industry standards for the project being Bid. If the Contractor believes the specifications are not within industry standards, the Contractor must bring its objection or concern to the DTA¢ attention prior to the Bid deadline.
 - 7. Prior to beginning work, the Contractor shall attend a mandatory preconstruction meeting with designated DTA staff to establish schedule, contact information, staging, work progression, approval process, change order procedures, etc., to ensure a timely and successful project.
 - 8. Contractor shall obtain any and all applicable permits required for the work and shall provide a copy of them to the DTA prior to commencing work, along with any MSDS sheets or other documents related to the materials used in the work, as applicable. Permit fees are the responsibility of the Contractor.
 - 9. Contractor is responsible for all required Code inspections that may be applicable to this [roject. If permit or code violations are discovered in any work performed by the Contractor under this Contract, the Contractor shall immediately correct all violations at no cost to the DTA; this provision shall survive the termination of this Contract.
 - 10. All materials used in the project must be new and meet or exceeds the minimum standards herein for quality and warranty. No rebuilt or refurbished equipment will be accepted. Any items

damaged during shipment or installation must be replaced with new items at the Contractors sole cost and expense.

- 11. Contractor shall be solely responsible for monitoring weather conditions and shall not permit employees to work when weather presents a danger to Contractors employees, DTA employees, or may cause damage to DTA facilities. Contractor should consider the impact of inclement weather on the progress of the project in its Bid; no additional compensation will be permitted for weather delays. Contractor shall proceed with work only when existing and forecasted weather conditions permit materials to be installed according to manufacturers written instructions and warranty requirements.
- 12. Contractor and any subcontractors shall provide all necessary safety equipment to perform the work in accordance with OSHA standards and shall be solely responsible for enforcing those standards. The DTA reserves the right to halt work if in its sole discretion, safety or security protocols or weather conditions are not adequate to perform the work. No additional compensation shall be afforded to the Contractor in the event the DTA suspends work due to safety, security or weather conditions. Contractor shall promptly rectify any identified shortcomings to the DTAcq satisfaction prior to resuming work.
- 13. Contractor shall coordinate work hours and the work progression with DTA Project Manager to ensure as little inconvenience to the building operations as possible.
- 14. The current doors are a model RCA60 Springless door system that measures approximately 20-feet wide by 14-feet high. All doors are equipped with an automatic sensor to permit entry and egress without leaving the vehicle.
- 15. Contractor may not block access to more than one door at time during the course of work to ensure adequate egress is available in the event of an emergency.
- 16. Limited door access shall be coordinated in advance with the DTA Project Manager at least 48-hours prior to closure. No doors shall be removed until the new equipment is ready to be installed.
- 17. Contractor shall follow all DTA safety guidelines while performing work under this contract, including wearing safety vests and/or safety glasses when accessing bus and maintenance areas.
- 18. Upon completion of work, Contractor shall participate in a joint walk-through with DTA staff to review completed work and prepare a punch list for Contractor to complete work. Contractor shall supply a complete summary of all work completed, warranty documents and other maintenance documents provided by the manufacturer. Contractor shall include training on operation and maintenance of the products supplied. Contractor shall immediately commence work on punch list items and shall complete the punch list work in a timely manner.
- 19. The DTA will withhold five percent (5%) retainage on invoiced amounts until the project is completed and accepted by the DTA.
- 20. Staging areas are limited and must be approved prior to project commencement. Temporary storage on the interior of the building may be permitted upon approval of the Project Manager

21. Bathroom facilities are available inside the building, but Contractors personnel will guard against tracking mud or other materials into occupied areas. Water and electricity is available at the project site.

B. Technical Specifications: Door Curtain and Equipment

- 1. The DTA intends to replace the maintenance door first, followed by the alternate exit door on the east side of the building.
- 2. The doors are interior surface mounted. No door frame or building modifications are required; Contractor shall fit the new equipment into the existing steel frame or rough opening.
- 3. Two angles form a curtain guide and are bolted to a continuous wall angle. Determination of size and suitability of the existing structural steel angles for the replacement equipment is the responsibility of the Contractor.
- 4. Removal and installation of any door guides for the new doors must include cutting out the existing angle and installing new structural guides in accordance with the manufacturers recommendations. Steel guides must be welded in place if used. Welds must be completed in compliance with all applicable Code requirements, including fire watch, ventilation, testing, inspections, etc., as applicable. Welded bonds must be painted to resist corrosion.
- 5. Each door must be equipped with a new Interior Control Station for manual operations of the door. Conduit for the Interior Control Station must enter through the side of the bottom of the control panel to minimize moisture intruding into the control box.
- 6. Contractor will remove the existing door curtain and associated equipment and dispose of them in accordance with all applicable regulations.
- 7. Contractor is solely responsible for securing the building while the work is in progress. Securement may include a temporary curtain or a hard cover on the exterior of the building to prevent access. All securement provisions must be included in the Contractors Bid price.
- 8. Curtains are black and composed of Styrene Butadiene Rubber (SBR) material, one quarter inch (1/4+) thick (6mm) single ply; each curtain weighs approximately 110 pounds. They include a nylon cord center with a tensile strength of 1,760 psi, 60-65 durometer, with a temperature range from -40°C to 85°C.
- 9. New curtain shall be Styrene Butadiene Rubber (SBR), EPDM or approved equal. SBR doors will include a strip of neoprene material a minimum of 1/8 inch thick by 1-1/2 inch wide, curtain wide 2-ply polyester cord center with a tensile strength of 900 psi. The neoprene will be bonded to the bottom of the curtain along its entire width to minimize any potential damage due to accidental impacts. The bottom of the curtain is to be notched at the bottom bar bolt locations to eliminate possible curtain damage due to accidental impacts and provide ease of bottom bar removal.
- 10. Wayne Dalton ADV-X Model 885 NBR Rubber doors and Dynaco-S731 rubber doors are accepted as approved equals.

- 11. Contractor must remove existing roll up drums and dispose of them in accordance with all applicable regulations. New drums must be industrial quality drums able to withstand the repeated use of the doors. Contractor will supply a cut sheet at the time of Bid Submittal with details of the drums, including warranty information.
- 12. Doors must have a wind lock and guide system to provide a near airtight seal, breakaway feature and easy reassembly upon impact. The doors must be configured as springless curtain wall inertia brake with stop-lock feature for unlimited cycle lift. Rolling door curtain and assembly, in the down position, to withstand wind-loads of 88 miles per hour (20 psf.)
- 13. The wind locks must be bonded to the vertical edges of the curtain and shall be a minimum of 1-5/8 inch (41mm) wide by 1/2-inch (13mm) thick with a 45° beveled inside edge. The beveled edge of the wind locks will include ultra-high molecular weight (UHMW) plastic strips, 5/8+(16mm) wide by 2-inches (50mm) long x minimum thickness of 1/8-inch bonded to the beveled portion of the wind lock, spaced 2-inches apart to minimize friction between the curtain and the guides during operation of the door. A continuous strip of UHMW plastic measuring 1-1/4 inch (32mm) wide by a minimum thickness of 1/8-inch (1.5mm) shall be bonded to the vertical edge of the curtain opposite the wind lock side. These continuous plastic strips shall be inset 3/8-inch (10mm) from the extreme outer edges of the curtain to q minimum of guide height to minimize friction between the curtain and the guides during operation of the door.
- 14. A bottom bar shall extend the full width of the lower edge of rubber curtain with a pull down arm extending into each guide. It shall be of sufficient strength to maintain the bottom edge of the curtain parallel to the door threshold at all times. The bottom bar shall be constructed of steel angle and flat bar bolted together and shall have a % aveak away+center section (max. door with to 20-feet) to reduce the risk of damage due to accidental impacts and provide ease of straightening during re-assembly.
- 15. All aluminum elements shall be isolated with bituminous coating in order to avoid direct contact elements of different metal.
- 16. Doors must be equipped with all of the following:
 - a. Electric operator
 - b. Manual chain hoist on the interior side of the curtain
 - c. Microwave motion sensors
 - d. Twin photocells
- 17. Manual operation requirements. Emergency manual chain hoist shall be provided on the interior side of the doors to allow manual operation. Chain hoist must be of sufficient capacity to operate a door at a maximum pull requirement of 20-30 pounds. Manual operation components must include easily accessed brackets to tie down the chains to ensure no entanglement with the door or pedestrians.
- 18. Contractor will provide all electrical work associated with this project:
 - a. Electric door operators must be UL approved, heavy duty gearhead type, prewired and able to withstand frequent daily operation in all types of weather. Two transmitters per door are required. Contractor may reuse existing control cabinets.

- b. Motors must be high starting torque, flange and foot mount, hoist type operating through a parallel helical hear reducer mechanism. The gear reducer is mounted on a heavy duty base of 5/16-inch steel.
- c. Operator must be equipped with built in electrical interlock to prevent motor operation during use of the manual chain hoist. The stop switch shall be integrated at the head to avoid breakage due to environmental problems.
- d. Door must include a Commercial Protector System. Provide non-contact photo safety sensors to sense an obstruction between jambs and signals for the door operator to reverse to open.

19. Electric Drive Motors.

- a. The DTA has replaced the motor on the West door exiting the maintenance area. This motor will be removed and retained by the DTA for use as a spare in the future.
- b. Bid responses must include all details of the motor, the expected useful life, ongoing preventative maintenance requirements, warranty and recommended replacement parts. The proposed replacement motor must be industrial grade and rated for the intended use of the doors, which cycle continuously throughout the day. The minimum warranty required on the door is five years, ten is preferred.
- 20. Respondent should also provide an option for an extended warranty on the door and motor.
- 21. Sensors. All doors must be equipped with industrial quality sensors able to withstand Duluth weather conditions, including freezing rain, snow, sleet, ice and heavy winds. Threshold sensors must be able to withstand freezing conditions without hindering operation of the door. Sensors and doors must be fully operational for cold conditions up to -50°F, and snow levels up to 48-inches deep.

Contractor must provide detailed cut sheets at the time of Bid submittal of all proposed sensors, including operational conditions and limits (i.e. temperature, show, etc.) and include all maintenance requirements (as applicable0 and warranty information.

C. Submittals

- 1. Contractor must submit a list of all proposed equipment at the time of bid, including a complete list of parts, materials, MSDS sheets (as applicable) and all warranty documents for DTA review. Acceptance of the Bid is contingent upon the submitted materials meeting the DTA requirements for useful life, quality, warranty and workmanship requirements.
- 2. Submittal must include each type of door arrangement, hardware, clearances, electrical characteristics, (voltage, size of motor, auxiliary controls and wiring diagrams, as applicable.)
- 3. Assembly details must also be included.
- 4. Any parts or materials that do not meet the specifications herein may be rejected. The DTA Project Manager shall provide comments of the submittals within five (5) days after receipt.

Contractor will promptly replace any parts or materials that were rejected with those items that comply with these specifications and resubmit them to the DTA Project Manager for review.

D. Warranty

1. Contractor will warrant all parts and labor for a minimum of 1-year; drive motors shall be warrantied for a minimum of 5-years and 100,000 cycles.

E. Project Completion

- 1. The first phase of the Project must be completed by January 31, 2022 unless otherwise approved by the Project Manager. Completion of the second phase of the project is subject to availability of funding and determination of need by the DTA Project Manager, but in no event shall be later than October 31, 2024.
- 2. At the completion of the work, adjust all equipment and apparatus as required so that it operates in accordance with applicable manufacturers instructions.
- 3. Prior to final payment, Contractor shall submit the following:
 - a. A complete set of record (%as-built+) drawings and submit them to the DTA.
 - b. Certified payrolls and lien waivers from the prime contractors and all subcontractors and/or suppliers.
 - c. Copies of all local inspection reports, as applicable.
 - d. A statement that all punch list items are complete and accepted by the DTA Project Manager.
 - e. A final invoice including retainage, as applicable.
 - f. Provide in a rigid binder, three (3) sets of equipment and system operating bulletins and instructions, including parts lists, maintenance manuals, system diagrams and electrical and control schematics (as applicable.)
 - g. Maintenance Data: Contractor shall provide maintenance and inspection data, replacement part numbers and availability and service location and telephone number.
 - h. Prior to DTAs acceptance of the completed work, deliver to the DTA the Contractors guarantee and manufacturers guarantee and warrantee certificates for equipment and materials.
 - i. Clean up. Before acceptance of the work, the Contractor shall clean the work site and all grounds occupied in connection with the work of all rubbish, excess materials, temporary structures, and equipment, and all parts of the work shall be left in a neat and presentable condition. Full compensation for cleaning up as herein specified shall be considered as included in the prices paid for the contract items of work and no additional allowance will be made therefore.
